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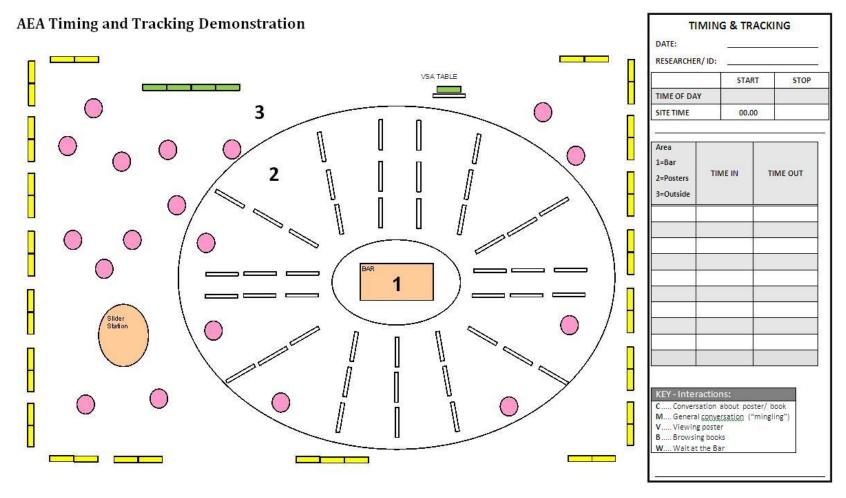

TIMING & TRACKING DATE: RESEARCHER/ ID: START STOP TIME OF DAY 00.00 SITETIME Area 1=Bar TIME IN TIME OUT 2=Posters 3=Outside



KEY - Interactions:

C.... Conversation about poster/ book

M.... General conversation ("mingling")

V..... Viewing poster

B.... Browsing books

W.... Wait at the Bar

Preliminary Results

- N=17
- Medians:
 - Bar area: 38 seconds
 - Poster area: 213 seconds
 - Peripheral: 110 seconds
- Most frequent behaviors:
 - Bar area: None (waited at bar)
 - Poster area: Stopping (12/17); Viewing (8/17); Mingling (7/17); Conversing about poster (5/17)
 - Peripheral: Mingling (10/17); minimal (2 or less) viewing,
 browsing books, waiting in line (for food, etc.)

Good thing this was a pilot!

Shirts

Map changes (upside down, scanning, slider station, poster rays/lines)



So what *is* T&T?

- Visitor circulation/patterns
- Physical location
- Recording, in detail, where visitors go and what they do (*mostly in exhibitions)

Fascinating! When did it begin?

- Robinson (1928) & Melton (1935, 1936)
- 1970s/1980s Loomis, Falk, Dierking, Bitgood, Serrell
- Now- Fairly routine "measure of success"





How does it work?

- Visitor observation (*typically individual, not group)
- From "entrance" 'til "exit"
- Representative sample (*typically adults)
- Stopwatch and map
- Variables:
 - stopping behaviors
 - other behaviors
 - observable demographics
 - situational variables
- Also important:
 - element(s) and group(s)
 - training/inter-rater reliability
 - technological methods







More on the Variables

Stopping behaviors

Where people went, where they stopped, and how they spent their time
(E.g. time at element, level of engagement, down time)

Other behaviors

What people did, above and beyond the stop (E.g. path, social interactions, use of objects/interactives)

Observable demographics

(E.g. estimated age, number in party, gender)

Situational variables

May affect visitor behavior (E.g. crowd level, day of week, special event)



What does it all mean?



Traditionally:

Are visitors behaving in the intended and expected manner?

How does it compare to other exhibitions?

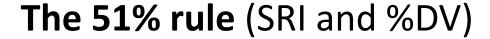
And more progressively:

Processes, engagement, disengagement, interest, social interactions and role changes
