
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

Speak to Engage



- Avoid reading from a prepared speech.
- Avoid reading directly from your slides either.
- Seek to engage your audience through more interaction. Adult learners already appreciate much of what you are saying. They just need to be reminded of it. If your audience is acknowledged for their own experience, their engagement in what you are saying increases significantly.

interaction bechniques can range from the simple (e.g. asking a question of the large group, taking informal point or give them a short quie to individually do in their seats) to the complex (e.g. put them in groups and give them a task).

Wherever possible, weave your own personal stories and examples into your talk. Storytelling can help you relax, and it immediately engages people and brings their attention back into the room.

Don't discount the power of using novelty in your presentation. I still remember during off in a talk when I the presenter suddenly put on a large Cat in The Hat hat. Bing! I was suddenly wide-awaie.

If you have an audience member who is monopoliting the discussion, you can do three things:

- a) quickly paraphrase what they've said so they feel heard
- b) slowly and subtly walk towards them decreasing the size of their 'stage' c) say. "Hmm. let's see what someone else has to say."




