1. Common challenges for evaluators

- Cost of data collection
- Access to difficult-to-reach groups
- Studying processes
- Studying behavioral change
- Incorporating the broader context
- Collecting / assessing qualitative data
- Mapping
- Quality control
- Evaluating complexity

Additional challenges for equityfocused educational transformation programs

- Giving voice to vulnerable groups
- Accessing difficult-to-reach groups
- Developing easy-to-use monitoring
- Addressing gender differences
- Communicating results to diverse stakeholders

2. Applications to education transformation evaluation: beyond monitoring

- Monitoring LMS/social media for references to equity-related topics
 - On-line content analysis software
 - Monitoring trends following different kinds of educational interventions
- On-line theory of change software for participatory planning and evaluation
- Qualitative data on behavioral change, contextual factors
- Giving learning ICTs to difficult-to-access groups
 - ** Giving them phones for evaluation purposes is controversial

3. Just don't forget the challenges

- Selection bias
- Capturing gender, ethnic and other social exclusion factors affecting program success
- Quantitative numerical bias
 - Data reduction
- Construct bias
- Identifying unintended outcomes
- Ignoring contextual factors
- Don't let your M&E systems be driven by neat ICT devices

Also remember that

- Low institutional capacity and resistance to change can sabotage your best intentions
- Privacy and protection risks change when you start using ICTs

- 1. Develop a quality M&E plan
- 2. Ensure design validity
- 3. Determine if and how new ICTs add value
- 4. Select or assemble the right combination of ICT and conventional M&E tools
- 5. Adapt and test the process with different audiences and stakeholders
- 6. Ensure institutional capacity to manage and use
- 7. Be aware of different levels of access and inclusion
