

- Contribute to the growing knowledge of intervention effectiveness
- Showcase the organization's technical excellence and lessons learned
- Create legacy: published literature is accessible online after the program ends
- Know that increasingly, sponsors are interested, and competitors are publishing



What Conditions Support Writing Teams?




What Is in the Resource Package? Resource Package: Three Parts

- Workshop session summaries and PowerPoint slides




How-to guides (44 two-pagers)

- Organized by audience and topic: for senior managers; lead author; introduction to journal writing; working with quantitative data; writing first draft; revising a manuscript; readiness of manuscript for submission; and after submission
- Each How-to Guide links to relevant Support Materials




