Why Publish in Journals?

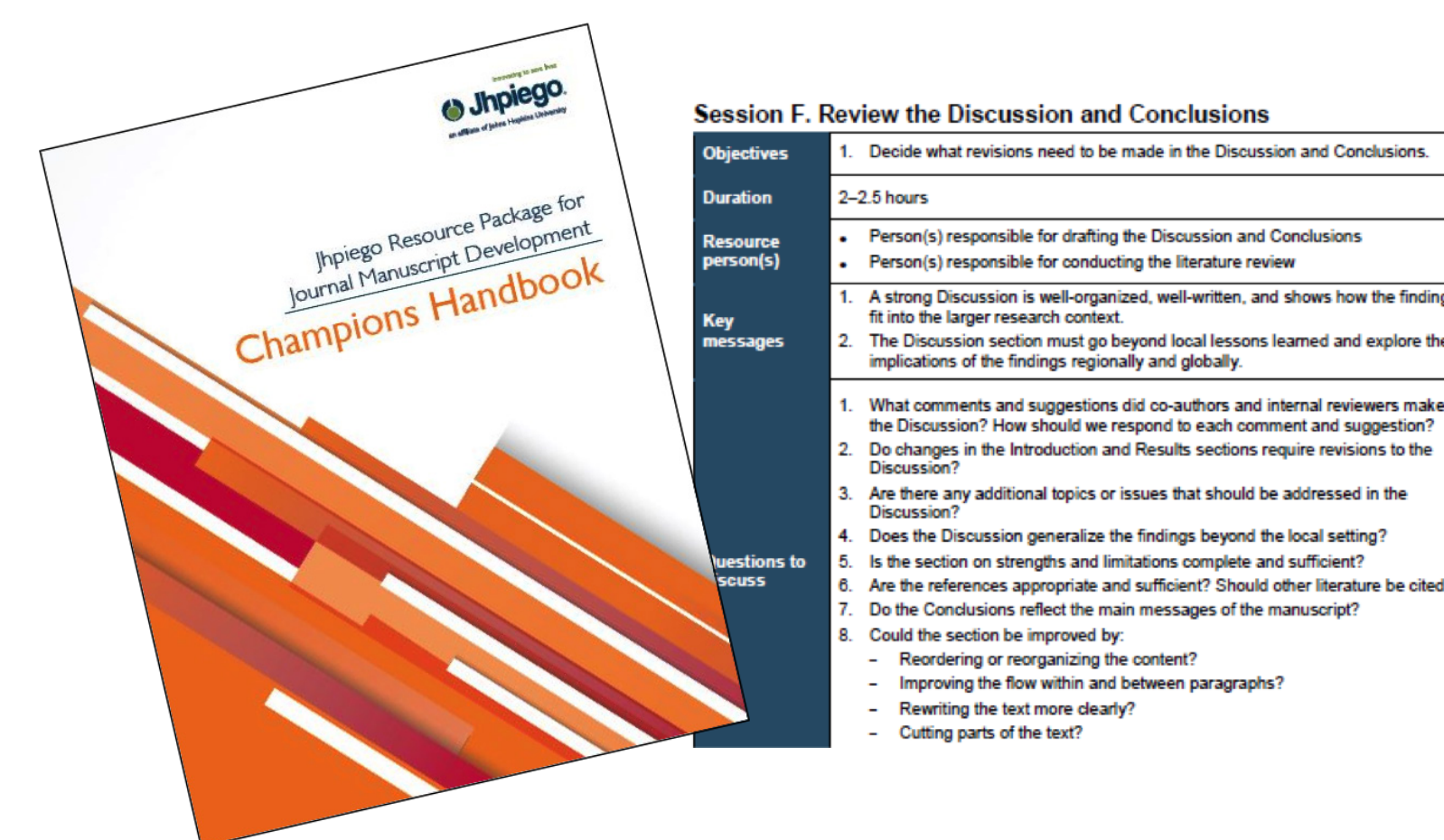
- Contribute to the growing knowledge of intervention effectiveness
- Showcase the organization's technical excellence and lessons learned
- Create legacy: published literature is accessible online after the program ends

What Is in the Resource Package?

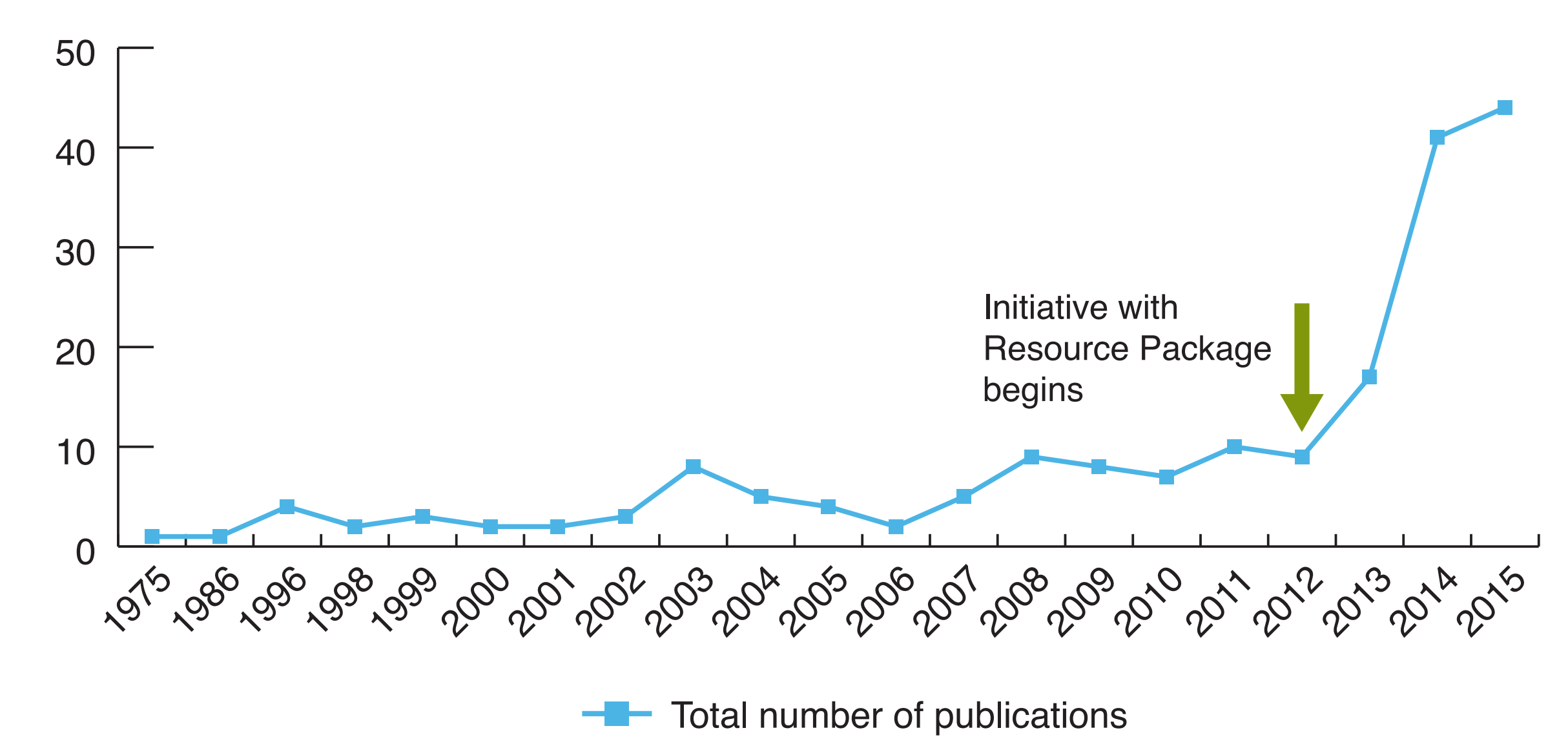
Resource Package: Three Parts

Total Number of Publications (1975–2015)

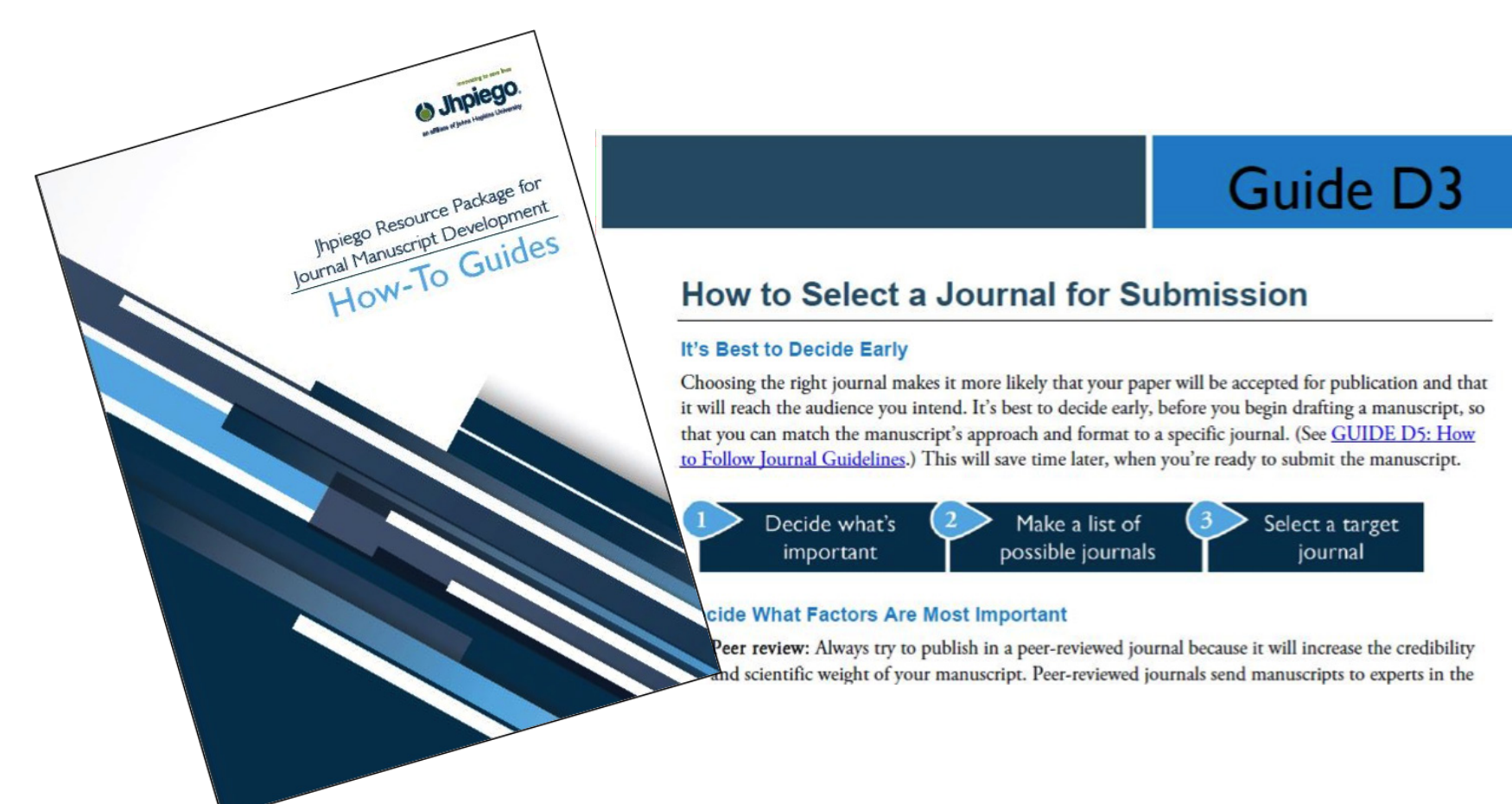


What Conditions Support Writing Teams?

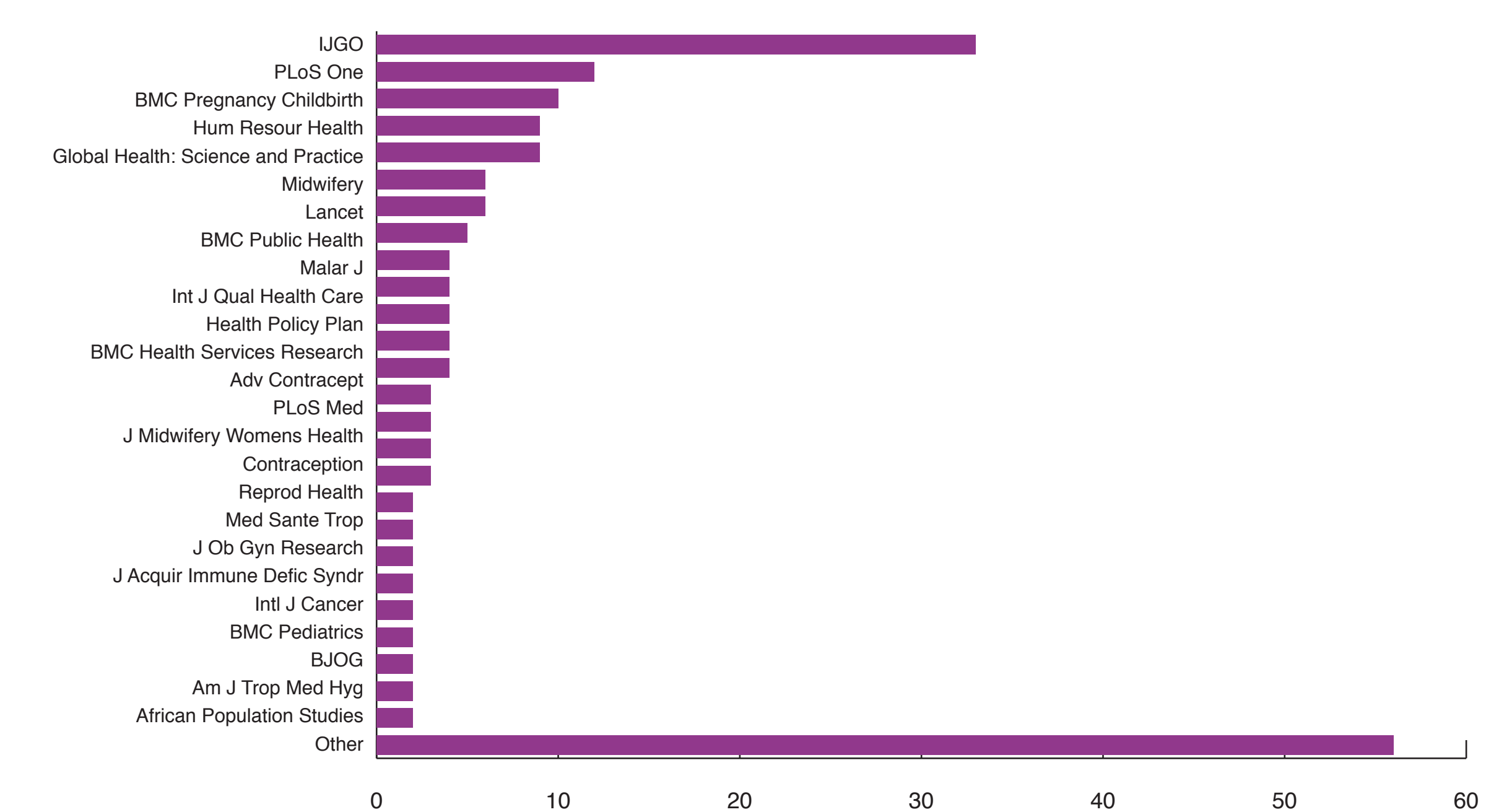


How-to guides (44 two-pagers)

- Organized by audience and topic: for senior managers; lead author; introduction to journal writing; working with quantitative data; writing first draft; revising a manuscript; readiness of manuscript for submission; and after submission

Most Common Journals for Publication (1975–2015)

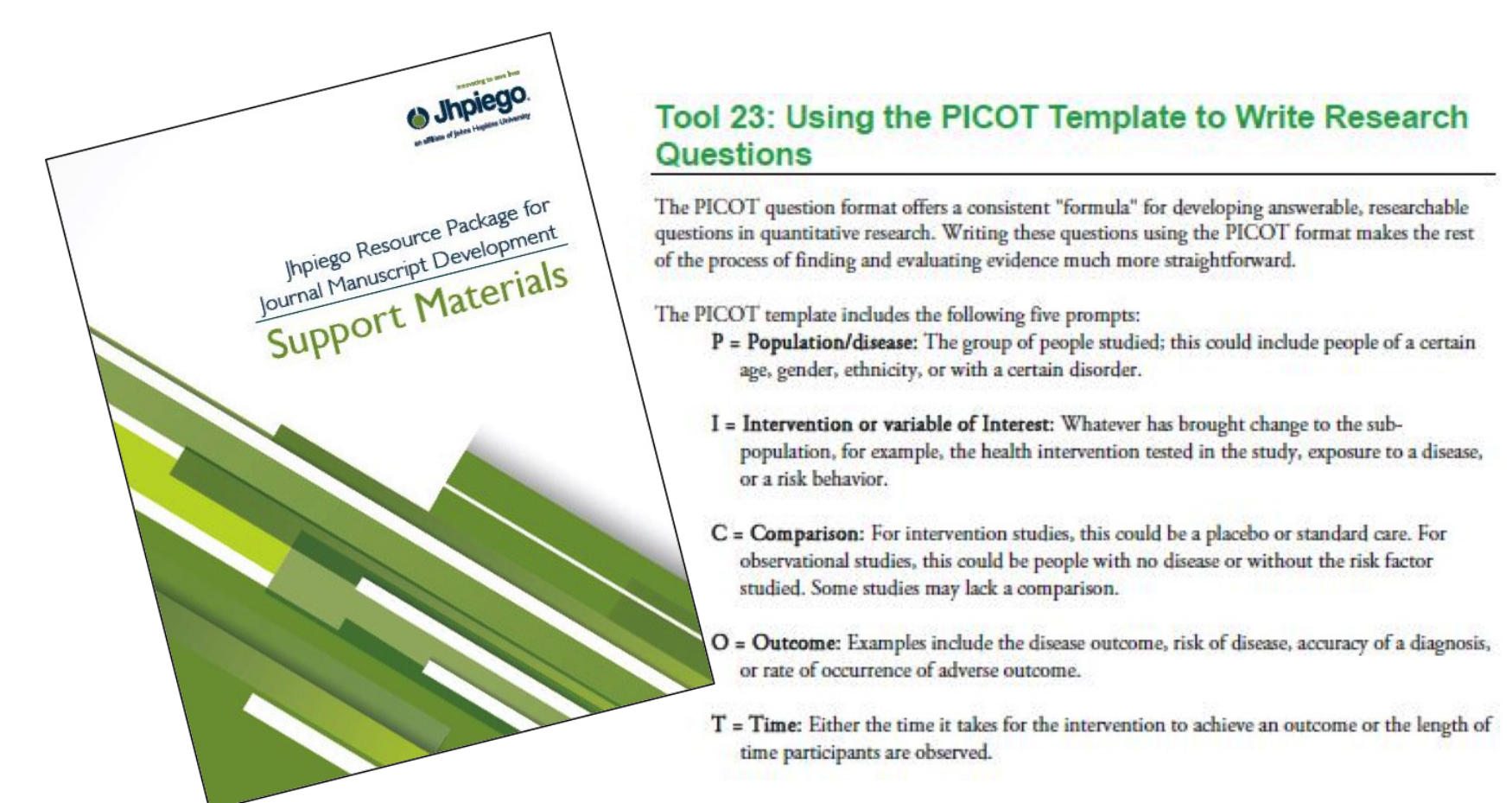
