Baseline Data for your Program?

Because a POW team has a statewide perspective, the team can develop a statewide sampling plan to collect baseline data and get buy-in from some educators for a year, rather than have every county educator collect data where the program is conducted. Sampling can reduce the burden on county educators and program participants statewide and provide a representative profile of the target audience statewide.

How a team should sample the target audience in a program depends on *the design* of the program and *how the program is delivered*. For information on this important subject, please go to the following Journal of Extension article:
