Background and Context

- Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD)
 - In 2007, foreign assistance totaled \$103.5 billion.

Findings Past Research • Prescriptive Methodologies: o 82% mandated methodology $\circ 28\%$ indicated flexibility in methodology

Findings Past Research:

• Short time frames = Quality?

	To submit proposal	Submission to start	Duration of evaluation
Mean	17	27	67
Minimum	5	1	17
Maximum	30	106	180

Findings Past Research:

- Only 10% provided range for evaluation budget
- Strict familiarity/experience requirements

Past Research Limitations:

- Small sample (n=48)
- Convenience sample

Strategies

Not too prescriptive or vague Example:

4.2 Key informant interviews with the UN agencies, GoU, other donors including DFID and SIDA at both country and head- quarters level, Local governments collaborating NGOs, and civil society. List of suggested initial key informants will be provided prior to the field work.



Plan in advance (2 months)



Clearly define budget parameters

- Evaluator or project budget range
- Evaluation budget commonly suggested to be 5-10% of project budget



Realistic time lines

- Posting of TORS/RFPs to submission 2 months
- Announcement to start of evaluation 1-2 months
- Evaluation time line at least 3 months

Example:

6.1 It is anticipated that up to 23 days' work per consultant will be required for the consultancy and that the humanitarian consultant will spend more of their days in the field. The start date of the consultancy is 26 July 2007 with an end date of 31 Augu 2007.

6.2 A draft report should be submitted by 17 August 2007 and a final report not later the 31 August 2007.

Realistic time lines



Provide feedback on proposals

-\$3,500 Opportunity Cost

- Cost approximately \$3,500 to prepare one proposal
- If 10 organizations submit proposals then \$35,000 worth of work.
