Background

- + Since 1993, *Juma* has served 2,500 teens across three California cities with programs in:
 - Job training & placement
 - College preparation
 - Financial training
 - Match-savings accounts for college



Breaking the cycle of poverty

Beliefs

Youth from low-income families as less likely to enroll in post-secondary education.

Financial capability education and college savings programs increase the likelihood that low-income youth will enroll, afford, and successfully complete post-secondary education.

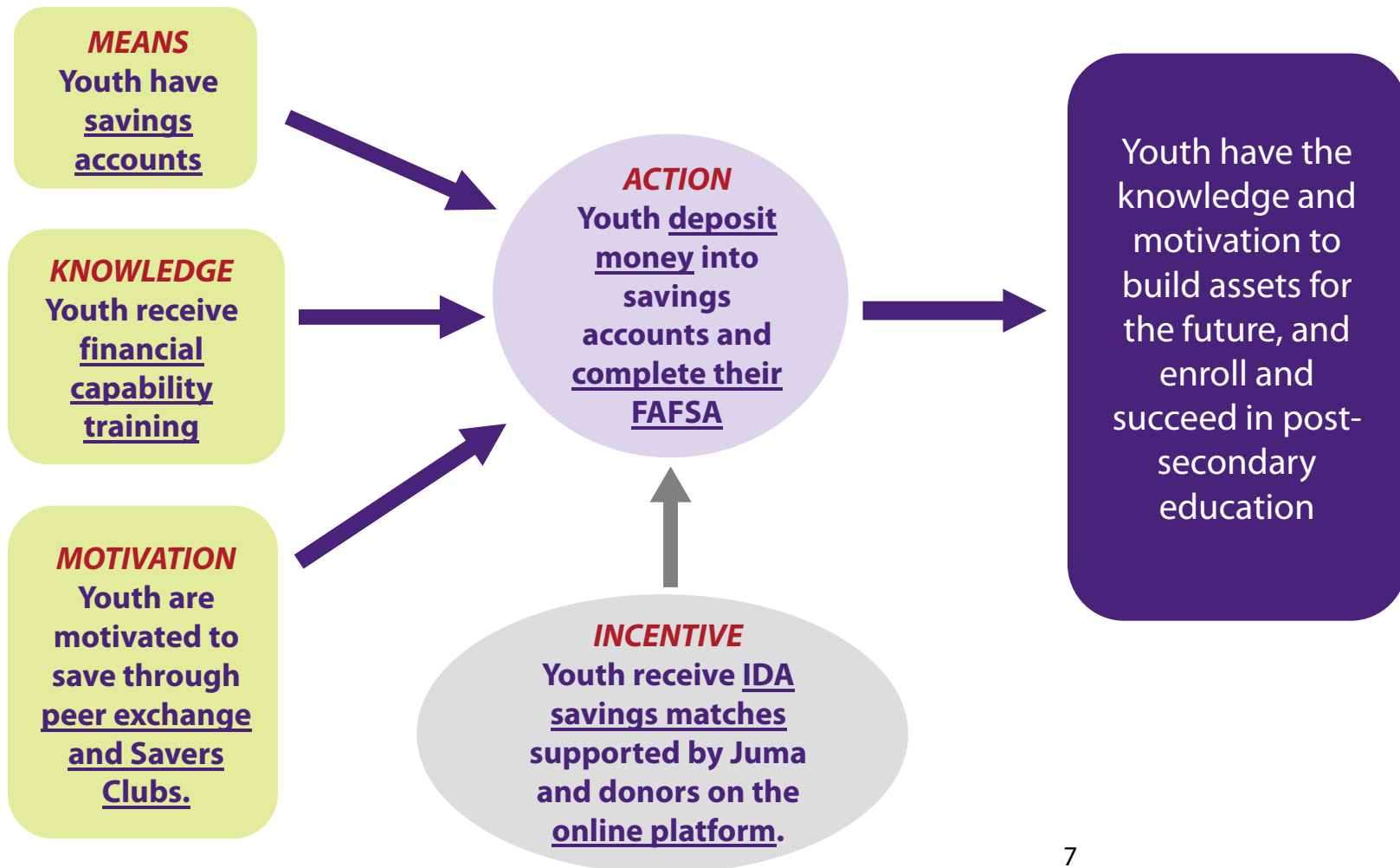


Goal

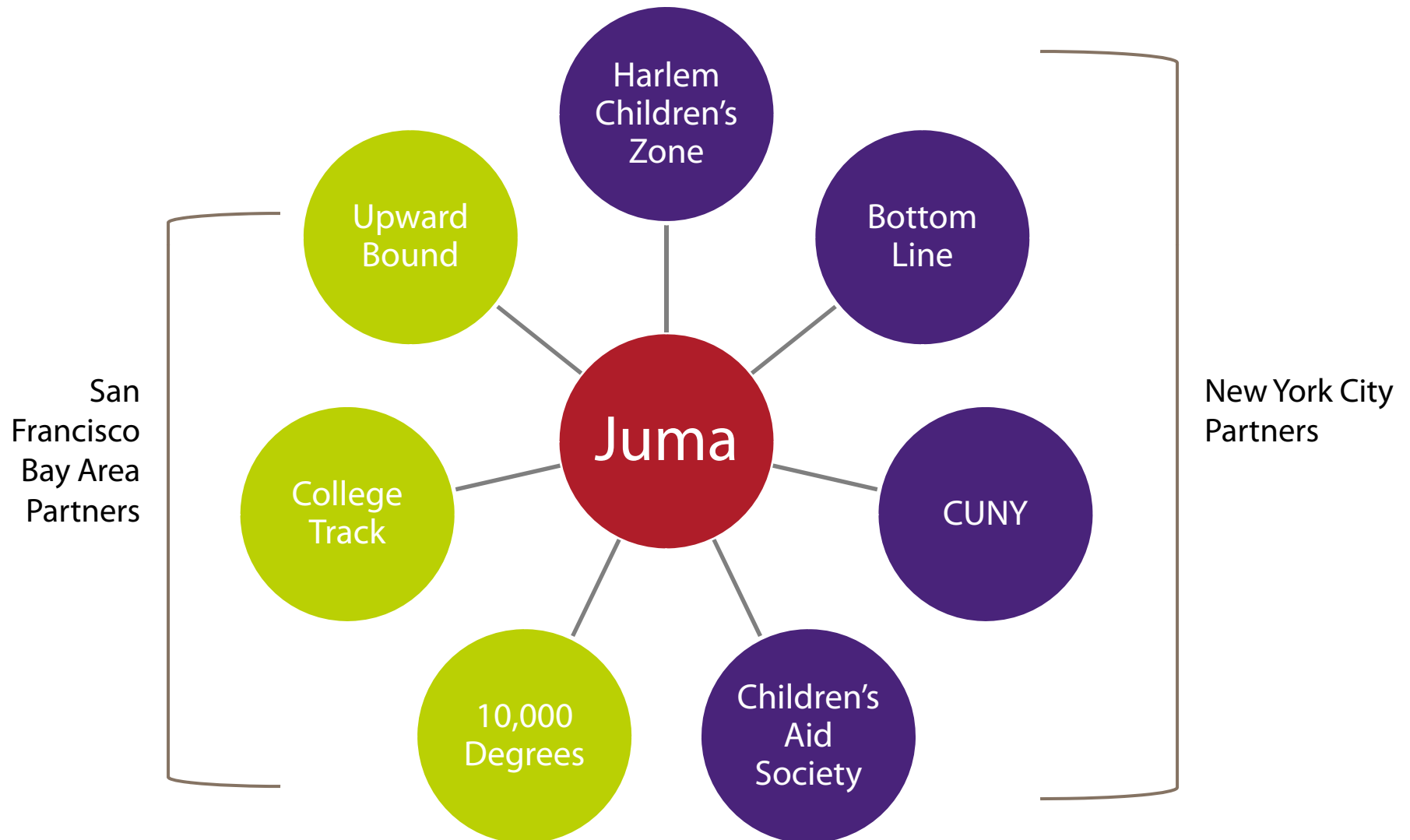
Through CollegeSet, low-income youth...

- + Break the cycle of poverty.

Year 1 Evaluation Questions

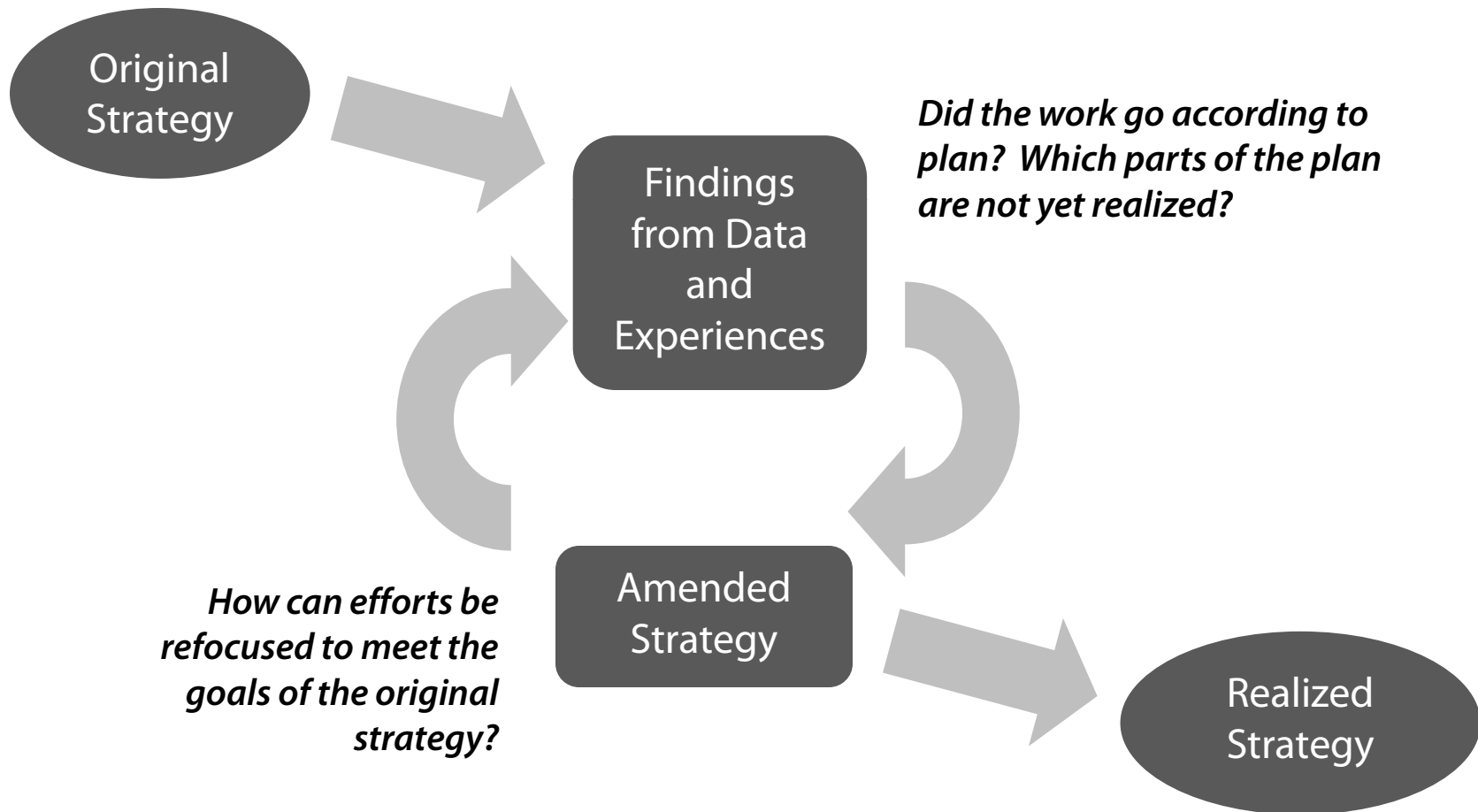
- 1) What components of the CollegeSet program are the most critical to students' success?

Real-time evaluation (RTE) approach



Characteristics of RTE

- + Getting the program to work as efficiently as possible, as soon as possible
 - In-the-moment feedback at critical decision points
 - Frequent in-person meetings and summaries of findings
- + Can be a bit more costly than traditional evaluation
- + RTE may not allow the same degree of rigor as traditional evaluation

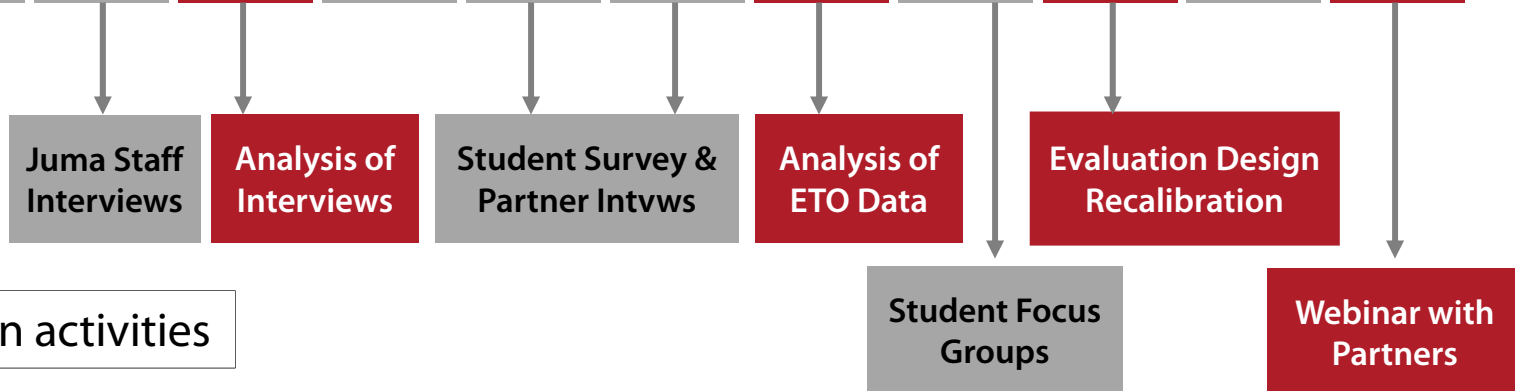

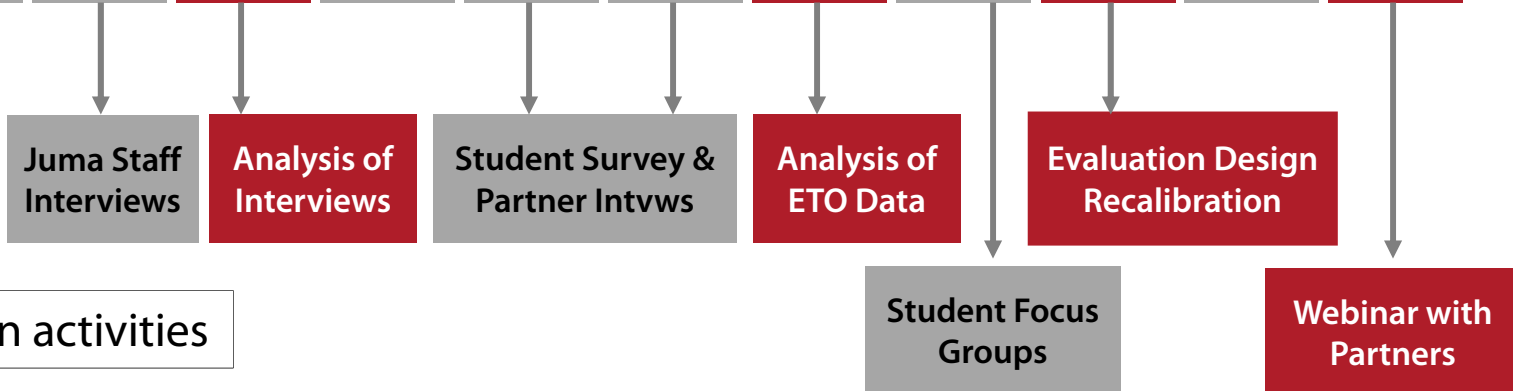

Lessons + Insights from Juma Ventures

Real-Time Evaluation...

Helps get feedback from stakeholders to shape program design.

Provides insight into program structure and how to improve it (such as communications and timeline).

Consolidates and draws connections between lessons learned.

Facilitates sharing of best practices across all program partners.

Lessons + Insights from Harder+Company

Real-Time Evaluation...

Can be a useful tool for programs looking to work as efficiently as possible, as soon as possible.

Works best with close coordination and communication between evaluation and program teams.

Reports are not just deliverables, but tools for conversation. Who needs to be part of that conversation? What types of decisions are the clients seeking to inform?

RTE evaluation plans are not static. They need to flexibly adapt to the information needs of the client.
