In the News - AEA's 2008 Outstanding Publication Award Winner



AEA member and University of South Carolina professor Abe Wandersman was featured in the September issue of Monitor on Psychology, a publication of the American Psychological Association. The article focuses on Getting to Outcomes (GTO), a guide that helps users bridge the gap from designing programs to designing programs that achieve their intended results. The guide - which Wandersman developed with former students Matthew Chinman, a behavioral scientist at the RAND Corp. and Pamela Imm, an independent evaluation consultant - includes 10 key questions for consideration. GTO is downloadable, tree of charge, and winner of AEA's 2008 Outstanding Publication Award.

Preliminary results are promising - indicating both better program quality and outcomes in groups using the guide - and the use of GTO is expanding.




