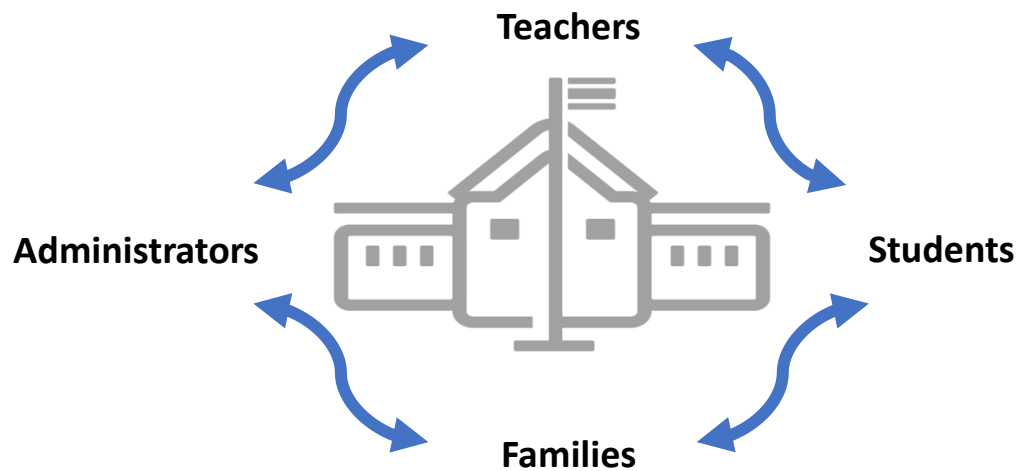
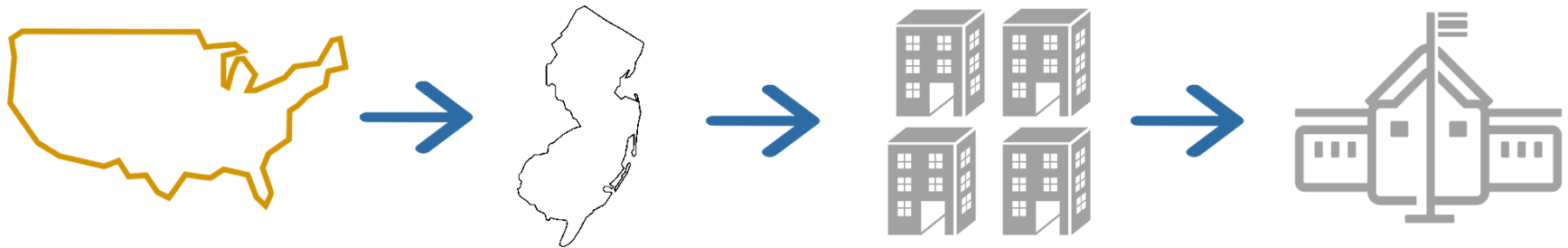
Demographics of Students Enrolled in SIG Schools



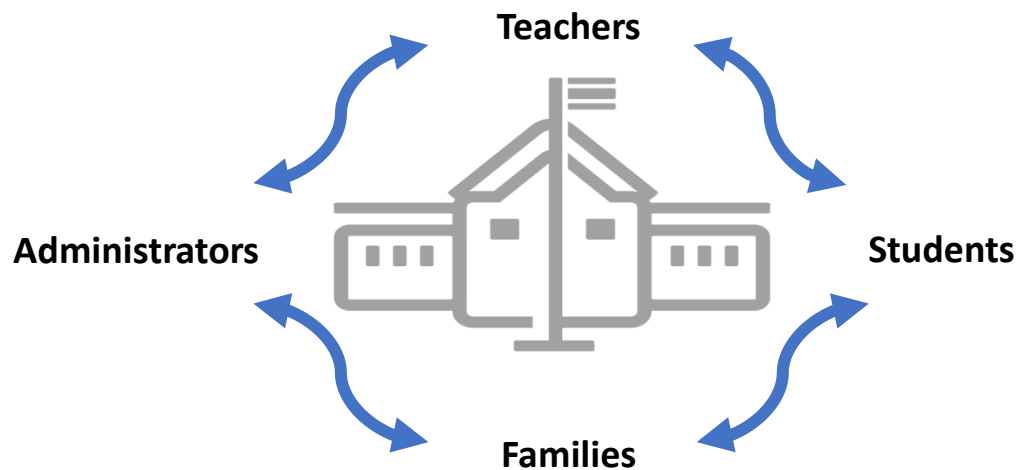
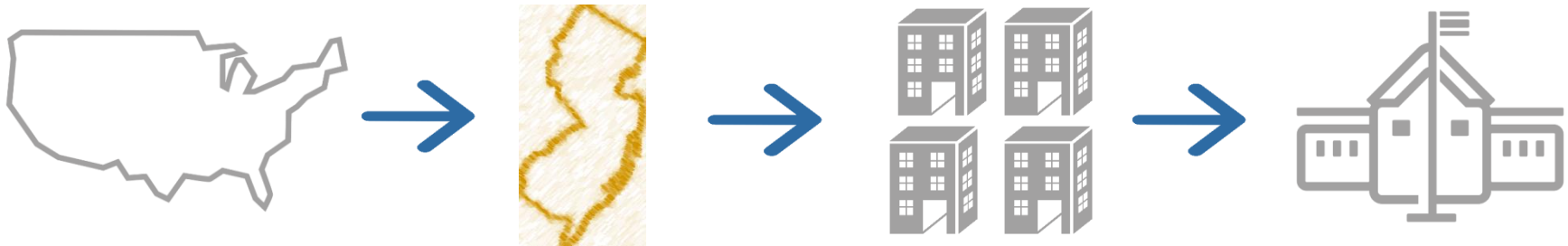
Standardized Test Performance of Students Enrolled in SIG Schools



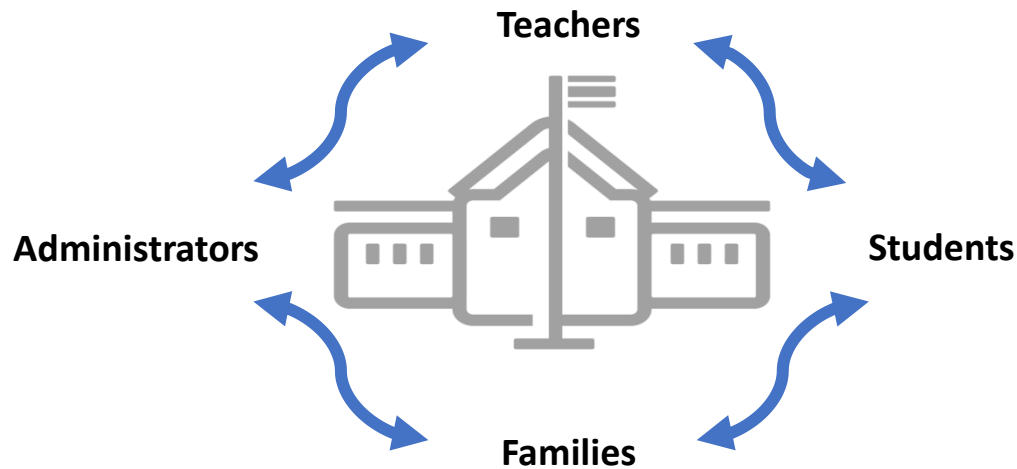
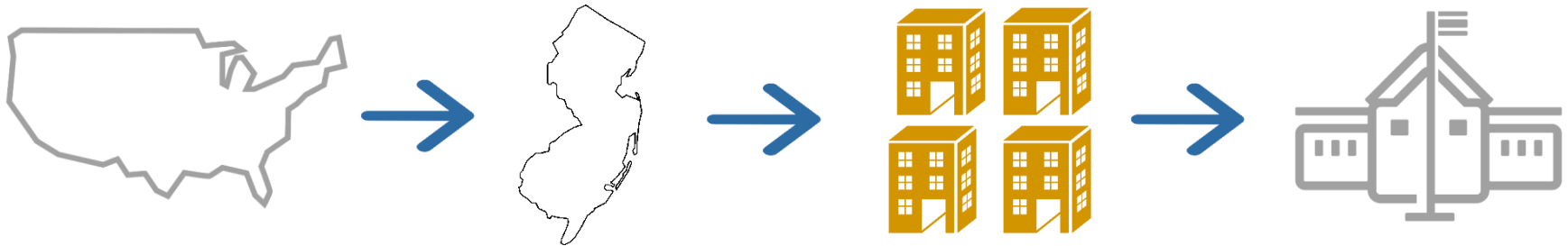
SIG is a federal program.



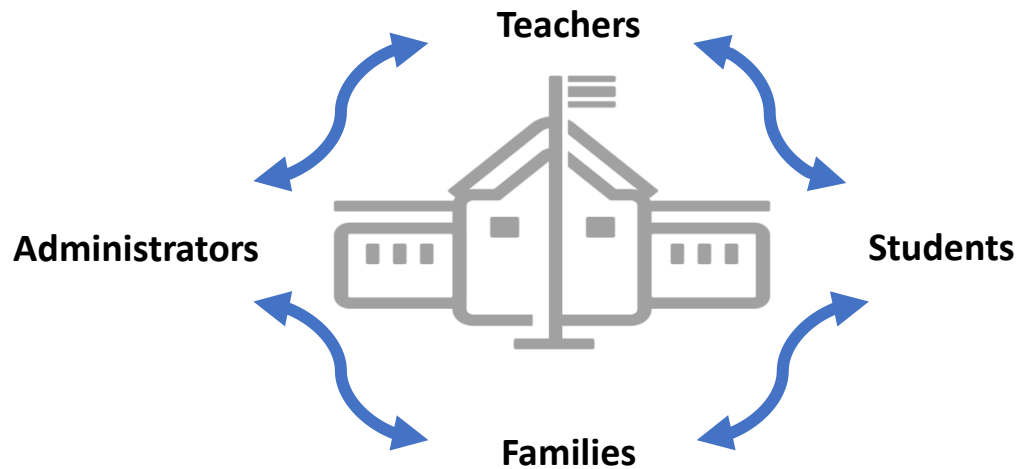
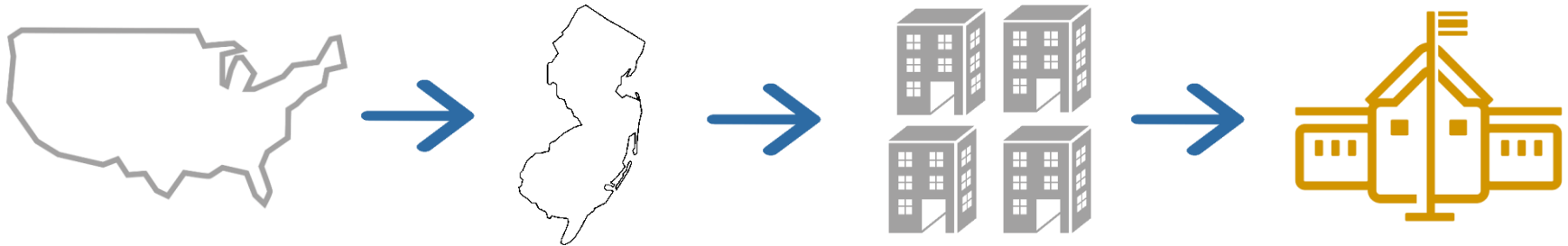
A grant from the USDOE funds reform at the state level.



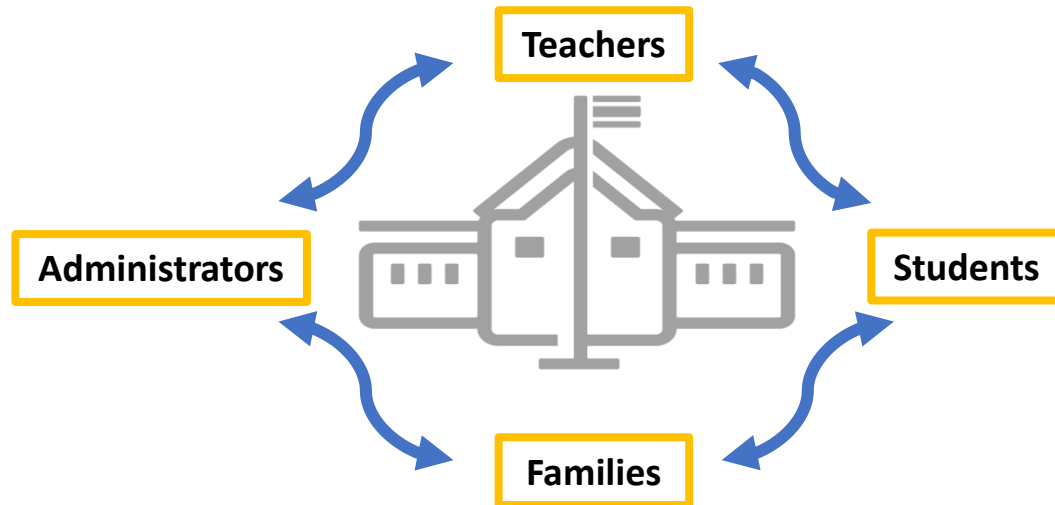
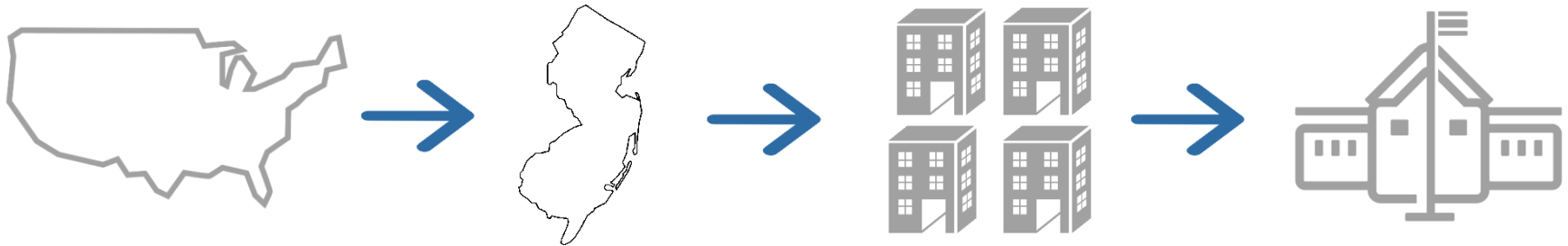
States may fund schools from multiple districts.



Individual schools were awarded the grant.



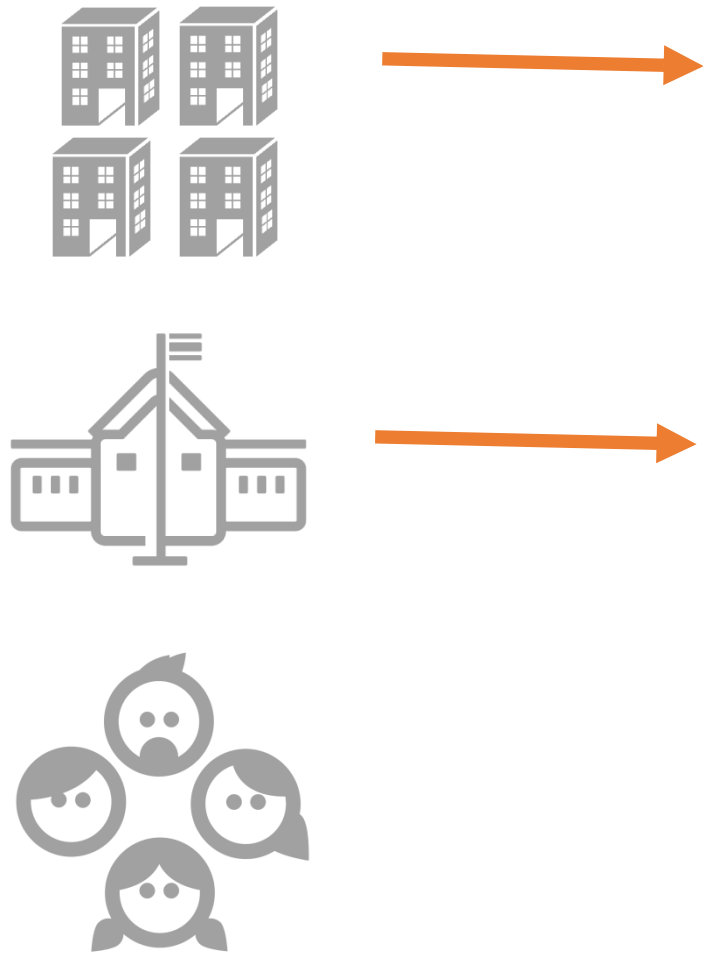
There are multiple stakeholder groups within each school.



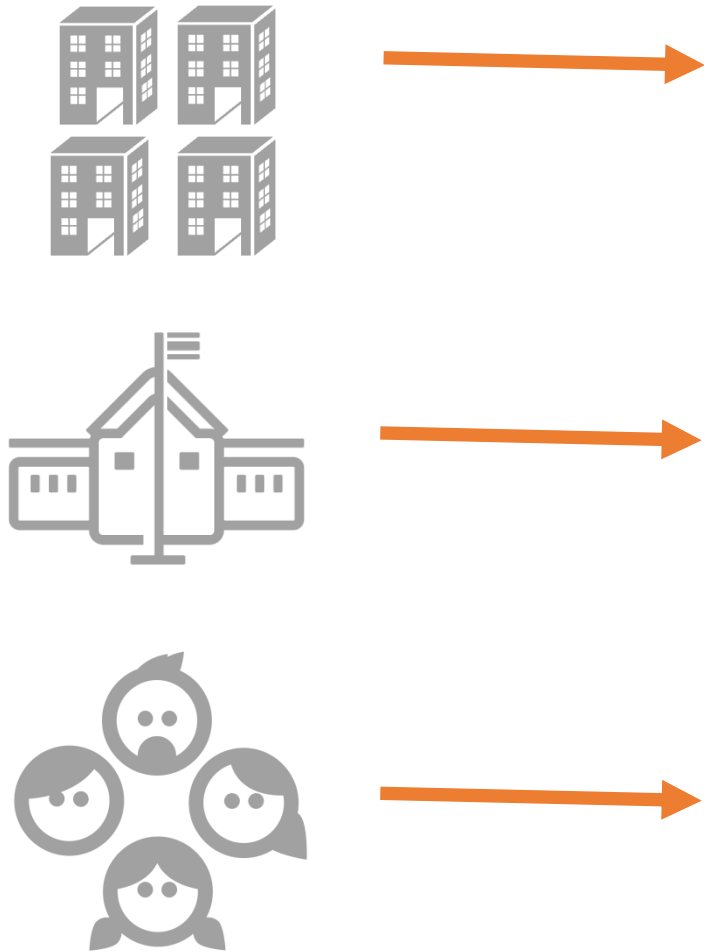
Districts inform the evaluation.

Administrators, teachers, families , and students inform the evaluation.



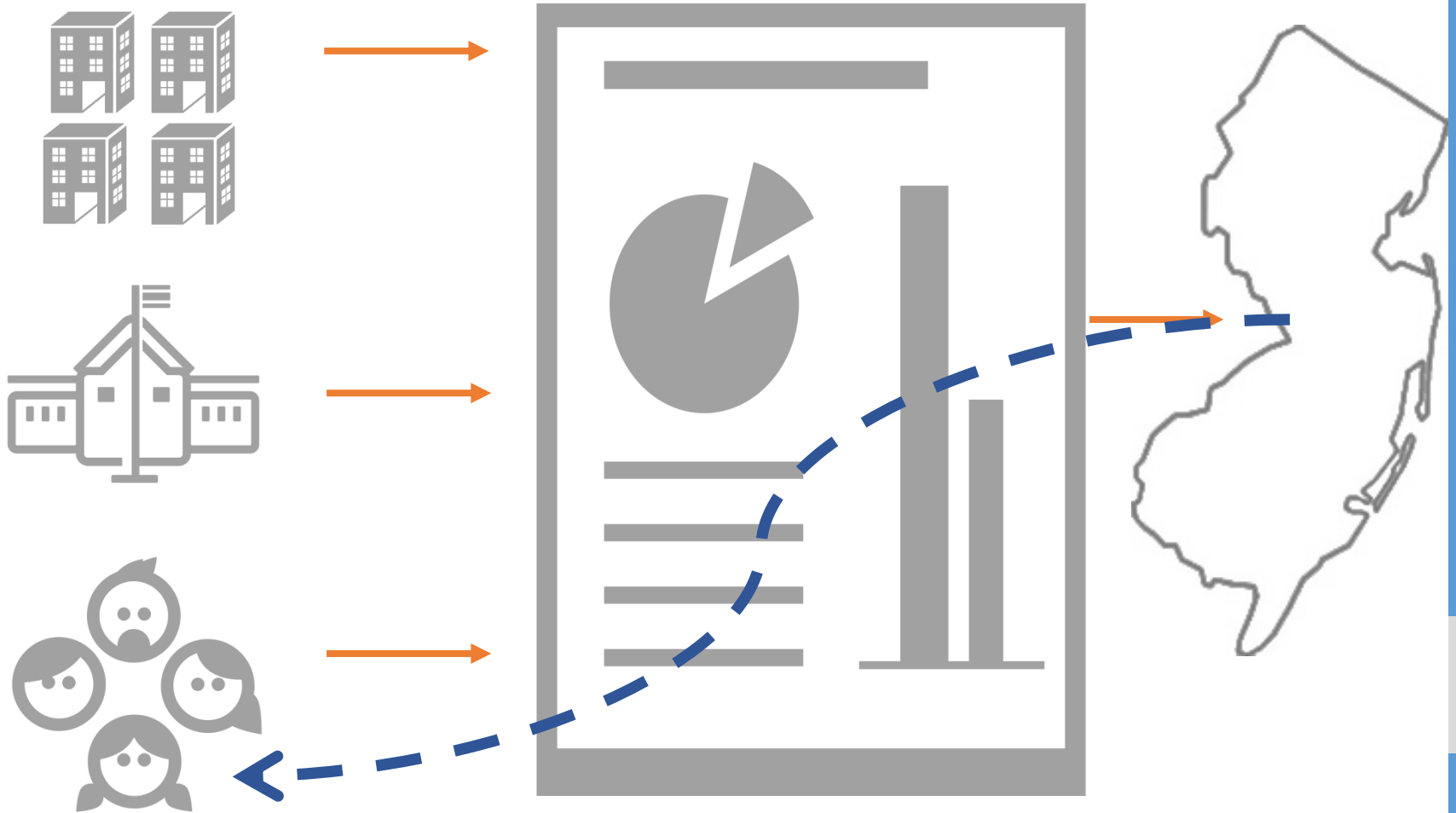
The State receives the findings.



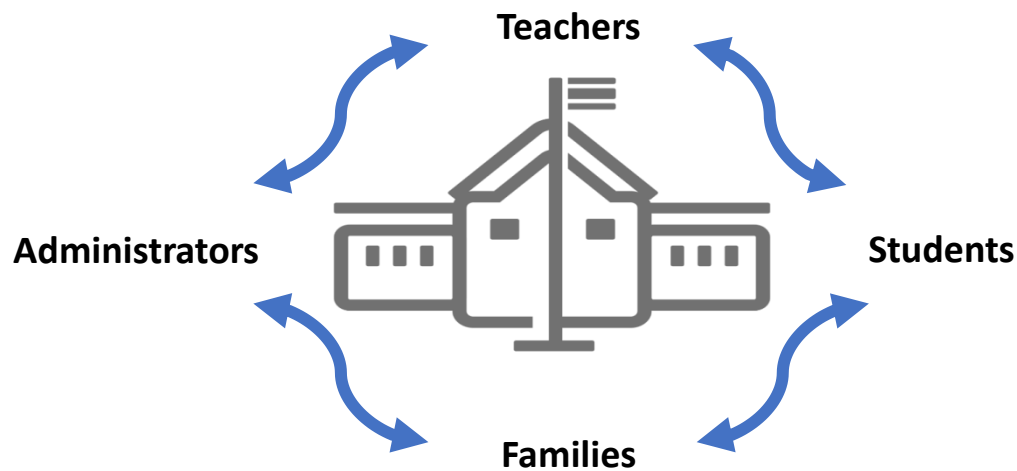
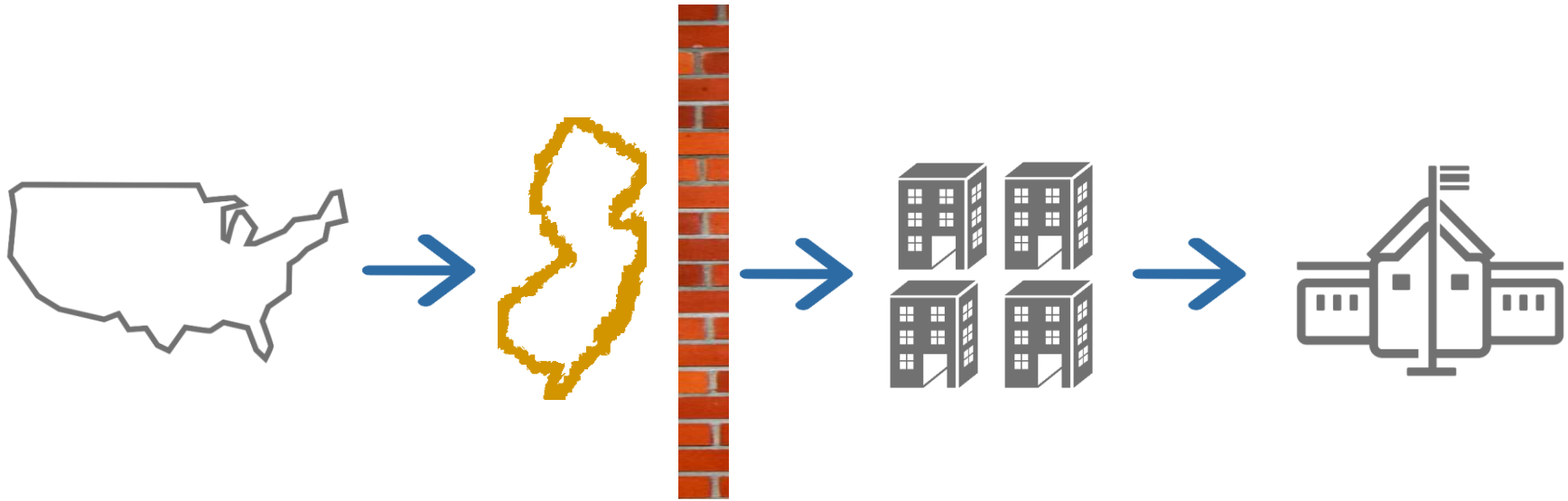
It would be ideal if all contributors received our report.

What do we need for this level?

- A detailed report
- Presentation of all findings
- Statistics
- Annotated surveys
- Instruments

District and School Level



What do we need for this level?

- Findings presented with graphs and tables
- Explanations of technical aspects of the evaluation
- Examples of how findings could be applied at the district and school level

Administrator, Teacher, Student, and Family Level



What do we need for this level?

- Data visualization
- Findings explained in very simple terms
- Examples of application to real life
- What the findings mean to each individual

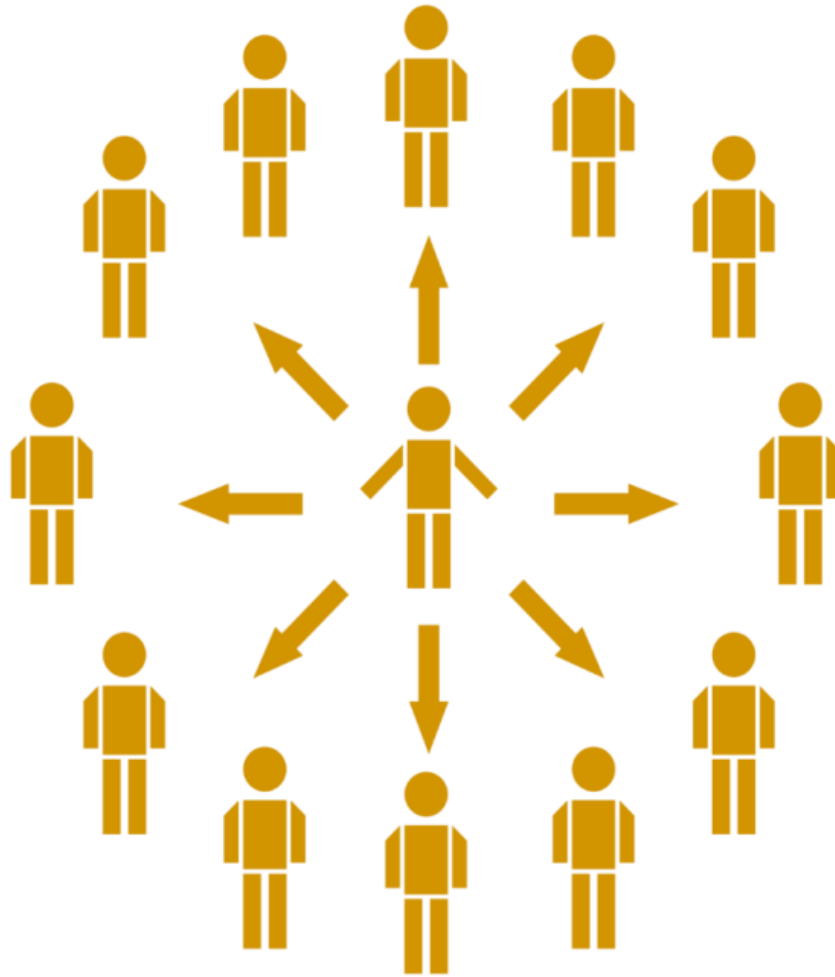
