Nonprofit Evaluation Support Program (NESP)



Works with Nonprofits to:

- build evaluation capacity
- measure program impact
- make a difference in the community

Customized Evaluation Support:

- Planning needs assessment processes (instrument development, sampling, data analyses)
- Strategic planning and framing objectives for grant applications
- Developing performance indicators or benchmarks and ways to assess them
- Searching for or developing instruments to evaluate implementation or impact of a program or service
- Framing evaluation questions and picking the best methodology for the questions
- Plans for collecting and analyzing quantitative and qualitative data
- Improving databases to enable better reporting
- Building your internal capacity to evaluate your impact in the community
- Providing feedback on evaluation components of grant proposals
- Professional development trainings



Context: UNCG's Commitment

- Priorities/Core Mission: Excellence in teaching/ learning, research/creative activities, and public service
- Community engagement as one approach and strategy to the above

Context: Greensboro's Community-Identified Priorities


- Financial stability of individuals and families

Recommendations

- Connect with your community engagement office!
- Relationship development is critical and it takes time
- Take time to do an authentic needs assessment
 - Key activities of interest to nonprofits and community conveners
- Consider Sustainability
 - Build interdisciplinary relationships, from places you might not expect
 - Key mission is educating students
 - Connections to curriculum (evaluation coursework)
 - Opportunities for applied experiences
 - Time for mentorship and oversight of contracts/workshops
 - Financial considerations
 - Pro Bono vs. Contract
 - Funders
 - Assistantships
 - Scalability
 - Student turnover
 - Faculty/staff time to mentor
